You can also combine this trip with an organized tour to **discover the beauties of Dalmatia**, the southern part of Croatia. During this tour you will visit the islands of Korčula and Hvar as well as the exceptional city of Split, using regular fast boat lines.

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INTRODUCTION

Dubrovnik is Croatia's southernmost city. The strategic position at the entrance of the navigation canals made of 1200 islands, was decisive for the development of the city. A state-of-the-art diplomacy granted the Republic of Dubrovnik a major role on the Adriatic Sea trade route, a crossroads between the West and the East. Trade was the basis of an exceptional level of wealth and development. The Republic never engaged in armed conflicts so today is one of the best-preserved medieval cities in the world! Each stone is at its place and has a story to tell. The nobles living in the old town had to refrain from displaying their wealth on the facades of their homes in order not to provoke social unrest. This resulted in the uniformity of facades which is still preserved. Slavery was abolished in the 15th century... The unique history and beauty earned Dubrovnik the status of UNESCO World heritage site and a flagship tourist destination on the Mediterranean.



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PROGRAM

Day 1: Arrival to Dubrovnik airport

Arrival at Dubrovnik airport.

Meeting with your driver-guide.

Transfer to your accommodation through the beautiful landscape of the Konavle region.

The accommodation is 4-star stone house built in the traditional style, featuring a swimming pool. The main idea is to live an authentic experience and discover the local culture.

Check in your apartment equipped with a kitchenette.

Welcome drink and dinner will be served at your host's.

The history of Konavle region dates to ancient times. The root of the name is the Latin word "Canalis", canals built by the Romans for their camp "Epidaurus", today's splendid town of Cavtat. Konavle has a special microclimate, the result of a privileged position between the Croatian Adriatic coast and the Sniježnica massif peaking at 1234 meters. The region is covered in beautiful cypress forests harbouring old stone villages. The irrigation of the fertile fields is provided by the river Ljuta.

The inhabitants nurture their traditions such as silk breeding, viticulture, olive growing and architecture. The tourist offer is enhanced by numerous agritourism restaurants, artists, folk dances in traditional costumes, ethnographic museums, maritime and land sports activities, hiking trails...

The region of Konavle offers numerous advantages for a great holiday: it's where the Dubrovnik airport is located, it's close to the Montenegrin border and the bay of Kotor.

You will discover one of the most renowned tourist regions of Croatia in a natural and peaceful setting offering an original, rich and genuine experience.



Day 2: Konavle terroir and traditions with typical lunch (half-day tour)

Breakfast.

Transfer to Cavtat.

Travel time: 15min

Walk around the Cavtat cape and visit the impressionist painter Vlaho Bukovac birth house.

Cavtat is one of the most beautiful towns in Dubrovnik region. The specific natural location sheltered by two capes was decisive for the Romans who chose this enchanting place to found the "Epidaurus" colony.

The Croats stormed ancient Cavtat and forced the inhabitants to leave. The refugees left and founded Dubrovnik, linking closely the history of the two towns. Today Cavtat is a typical fishing village with lush captain's residences. Visit the family Račić mausoleum made by the famous Croatian sculptor Ivan Meštrović, the house of the impressionist painter Vlaho Bukovac, and the Franciscan monastery. Stroll on the beautiful seaside promenade around the capes.



Proceed to the town of Gruda located in the heart of Konavle region.

Travel time: 15min

Visit the AR art gallery and workshop of the academic painter Antonija Rusković. The workshop has received the national label of the art protection for the Konavle embroidery.

The Konavle region is known for silk production and embroidery. The tradition is still alive as women pass on family motives from mother to daughter. The woman's pride and skilfulness are displayed by the embroidery of her traditional costume. The silkworm disappeared from Konavle during the Independence war of the 1990s. A women association from Konavle helped by a French NGO reintroduced the silkworm and thus saved this precious tradition.

The AR workshop manufactures silk in the traditional way. The cocoons are used for the extraction of silk threads and for educational purposes. The workshop also harbours a rich collection of embroidery decorating traditional costumes and items used in everyday life.

During the visit you will get an insight to the historical and sociological aspect of the Konavle region. You will discover the metamorphosis of the silkworm from egg, larvae, caterpillar to butterfly. You will see a demonstration of silk thread production,



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costume making and embroidery from Konavle, an invaluable and typical heritage.

The presentation lasts approximately 30 minutes, at the end you will taste traditional "sweet delights" and homemade liqueurs.

Transfer to the river Ljuta. Travel time: 10min

Lunch in the restaurant Konavoski Dvori.

Konavoski Dvori stands for "the palaces of Konavle", a large complex of water mills using the Ljuta river (meaning "the furious"). During Yugoslavia, one part of the complex was restored to create one of the most renowned restaurants in southern Croatia. Even if other restaurants in Dubrovnik region claim fine gastronomy, the tradition and the setting of the Konavoski Dvori restaurant remains unmatched. The waitresses are dressed in traditional costumes and the food is entirely organic. The natural setting is magical.



Traditional dinner cooked « under the bell » (very original)

The meal reveals the typical „under the bell“ cuisine: veal, lamb and potatoes are put on a metal platter, on a bed of embers and covered with a metal bell-shaped lid. The meal is cooked for 3 hours in the stew. Food becomes crisp on the surface but melts on the inside. Order good local wine and experience true gastronomical pleasure!



Menu

Local aperitif: liqueurs and brandies

Starter: Dalmatian smoked ham and Pag Island cheese selection with olives

Main dish: veal and lamb with potatoes cooked under the bell

Dessert: carob cake

Beverage package (1/4l of wine or beer or juice + 1/2l of water + coffee or tea)

Transfer back to your accommodation.

Dinner on own (you can stop at a grocery store on you way back or we can organize taxi transfers to one of Konavle restaurants, your guide will point out the best restaurants).

Day 3: Dubrovnik and the riviera by boat

Breakfast.

Transfer to Cavtat and board a boat (regular line) to Dubrovnik.

Sail along Dubrovnik riviera and arrive in the medieval town the old way, from the sea!

Walking tour with a local guide including the entrance to the Franciscan monastery and the Rector's palace. You will also see the main pedestrian street "Stradun", the Dominican monastery, the Cathedral, the Saint Blaise church, the Sponza palace and the old harbour. Walking tour duration: approximately 2h

Dubrovnik was a Mediterranean city-state which managed to preserve its freedom and avoid conflicts by means of a very skilful diplomacy. The prosperity of the old Republic is palpable on every stone of Dubrovnik, one of the best-preserved medieval cities in the world. "The Pearl of the Adriatic" is part of the UNESCO World Heritage.



Your tour guide will give you the « Dubrovnik Card » allowing free entrance to the walls, the modern art gallery, the maritime and ethnographic museums...and discounts in some shops and restaurants in the old town.



Time at leisure for lunch and a personal discovery of the old town. We recommend visiting the beautiful city walls!

Transfer back to your accommodation.

Dinner on own (you can stop at a grocery store on your way back or we can organize taxi transfer to one of Konavle restaurants, your guide will point out the best restaurants).

Day 4: Ston on the Pelješac peninsula and discovery of mariculture by boat with show cooking at sea

Breakfast.

Croatia is renowned for the 1200 islands archipelago and one of the most indented coasts in the world. Scientist Jacques Yves Cousteau said Croatia has one of the most transparent seas of the Mediterranean. The virtually intact ecosystems which are now protected by law, managed to preserve the precious flora and fauna. We invite you to discover Croatian mariculture and cuisine which are among the most renowned in the Mediterranean basin. During this exclusive and original tour, you will visit a shellfish production site and taste autochthonous oysters, mussels and fish... live show cooking on your boat!



Drive on the scenic seaside road offering beautiful views on the Elaphiti archipelago to Veliki Ston, set at the beginning of the Pelješac peninsula.

Travel time: 1h15

Time at leisure in Ston.

Ston is a charming 14th century stone town, harbouring the still active saltworks built at the time of the Dubrovnik Republic. However, the most remarkable monument are the defensive walls, among the longest in Europe, a genuine human exploit!

Continue to the neighbouring town of Mali Ston, where you will embark on a Dalmatian wooden boat "trabakula". You will first sail to the mussel and oyster fields to learn about the farming process and for oyster tasting. You will then sail to a small deserted island for a swim while a cook prepares in front of you the mussels "buzara" with olive oil, garlic and parsley. A glass of white wine from the famous Pelješac vineyards will enhance this typical dish. Your captain will then take you to the fish farming basins (bream and sea bass). Fish with nets and prepare the catch on the boat's barbecue. Enjoy lunch during the return to the harbour of Mali Ston. An authentic experience to discover real Croatia.

Transfer back to your accommodation. Travel time: 1h15



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Dinner on own (you can stop at a grocery store on you way back or we can organize taxi transfers to one of Konavle restaurants, your guide will point out the best restaurants).

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EXTENSION 1: PRIVATE CRUISE ON A SAILBOAT, 3 DAYS IN THE ELAPHITI ARCHIPELAGO, THE NATIONAL PARK ON THE ISLAND MIJET AND THE PELJEŠAC PENINSULA

Day 5: Islands Koločep and Lopud – overnight in Saplunara bay on the island Mljet

Meeting in the Lapad bay, Dubrovnik, departure point for the private cruise.

Travel time: 30min

The sailboat is 12m long and can accommodate 4 persons in 2 cabins. It features a living room with a kitchenette, a bathroom with a shower and a third cabin for your English-speaking skipper.

The price includes the boat rental with a skipper, fuel, sheets, towels, insurance, mooring costs, snorkelling masks.



Elaphiti islands are the southernmost archipelago of Croatia and the Adriatic Sea. The archipelago is made of 13 islands, 3 are still inhabited today, Koločep, Lopud and Šipan. Koločep was an ancient Greek colony from the 4th century BC, it harbours pretty Croatian pre-Romanesque churches and a protected nature park offering beautiful and easy hiking trails. Lopud is known for the maritime tradition, its palaces witness the golden age of the shipping trade during the Dubrovnik republic era. The island is also known for the beautiful sandy beach Šunj. Šipan has a large concentration of olive trees and is called "The Golden Island". The village Suđurađ shelters the only nobles' residence of the former Republic of Dubrovnik that is fully restored and can be visited. You can discover the typical rural architectural heritage of the region. The Elaphiti islands are famous for their exceptionally transparent waters. This cruise will take you on a trip between dream and reality of an almost untouched beauty.

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You will first sail to the island of Koločep and the Blue cave. Swim in an enchanting environment where light enters through the opening of the cave just below the sea surface, creating a bluish gleam. This phenomenon can be admired only in exceptionally transparent waters.

Sailing time: 1 hour

Continue to Lopud, the island of wealthy shipowners, famous for its pretty sandy beaches. Sailing time: 1 hour

Time at leisure and lunch in one of the restaurants by the sea.

Continue to the secluded Saprunara bay, located on the southern side of the island of Mljet, renowned for a beautiful sandy beach and untouched nature. An authentic, off the beaten track location. There is also a restaurant offering fresh sea products.

Sailing time: 2 hours

Overnight in Saprunara.



Day 6: National park on the island Mljet – overnight in Pomena, part of the national park

Sail to the entrance of the national park Pomena, along the side of Mljet looking at the open sea.

Sailing time: 2h

Time at leisure to visit Mljet national park with the Saint Mary islet (entrance included).

According to a legend, Odysseus spent 7 beautiful years on the island of Mljet, in the arms of the nymph Calypso. Mljet is covered in pine and oak forests. The main feature of the island are two joined lakes, connected with the sea by a narrow passage. On the bigger lake there is another island, so we have an island on the island! This unique phenomenon was created by the rising of the sea, dating back to 10,000 BC. The Saint Mary islet harbours an ancient Benedictine monastery from the Middle Ages and a small restaurant.

This is a perfect spot for swimming as the water temperature of the lakes is at least three degrees higher than the sea temperature. After the visit you will understand why Odysseus wasn't keen on leaving Mljet.



Day 7: Trstenik on the Pelješac peninsula and the island of Šipan – overnight in Dubrovnik

Sail in the Mljet canal between the island of Mljet and the Pelješac peninsula, to Trstenik.

Sailing time: 1h

Pelješac is the longest Croatian peninsula, a region of wild beauty with crystal clear sea and hidden bays. It is renowned for a native grape variety, the Plavac Mali, one of the best red wines of the country.

Time at leisure in Trstenik. We recommend wine tasting at local winemaker's shop and a swim.



Proceed to the village Suđurađ on the island Šipan. Sailing time: 1h

Time at leisure to discover Suđurađ and a swim. We recommend visiting the Skočibuha residence, a unique rural palace of the Dubrovnik Republic nobility. Restaurants can be found in the residence and in the port.



Return to the Lapad bay.

Sailing time: 1h15

The accommodation is not included. We recommend spending the night in hotel Kompas, located on the pedestrian street of the Lapad bay. Kompas is a beautiful 4-star hotel with high comfort standards. We can book a room for you in hotel Kompas or any other hotel in town.



Day 8: Departure from Dubrovnik airport

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EXTENSION 2: STAY IN KONAVLE REGION – RELAX AND DISCOVER

We suggest staying 3 additional nights in your accommodation in Konavle with a rental car for a personal discovery of Dubrovnik region. We can also book a driver-guide for you.

VISIT RECOMMENDATIONS:

TRSTENO ARBORETUM

The Trsteno arboretum is a sumptuous garden of a former patrician residence of the Dubrovnik nobility. The arboretum was a filming location for the *Game of Thrones* series and offers a splendid view on the Elaphiti archipelago.

You will discover the landscape architecture of the gardens of the former Republic of Dubrovnik, a blend of Arab and Italian influences. The nobles living in the old town had to refrain from displaying their wealth on the facades of their homes in order not to provoke social unrest. However, the competition was fierce in the field of botanical diversity and beauty of their villa's gardens outside the town. Commercial ships were used to bring seeds and soil from distant lands.



THE ISLAND LOKRUM FROM THE TOWN OF CAVTAT

A regular shuttle boat line connects Cavtat and the island of Lokrum, located opposite to the old town of Dubrovnik. Sailing time from Cavtat to Lokrum : approximately 15 min.

Lokrum is a hidden gem of nature famous for the 11th century Benedictine monastery. Napoleon built a fortress on the top of the island which later belonged to the Habsburgs. The island of Lokrum offers also a rich botanical garden from the Yugoslav period, today a protected uninhabited nature reserve with pretty walking



paths, a cafe and a restaurant. Lokrum also harbours a miniature "Dead sea", a lake on the island created by the infiltration of sea water. The temperature of water in the lake is always a little higher than the sea temperature. Lokrum is the favourite swimming spot for the local population.

HIKING ON THE KONAVLE CLIFFS TRAIL

The Konavle region offers several hiking trails. The easiest (level 2/5) and most attractive trail starts in the village Radovčići and goes to the town of Cavtat. The trail follows the cliffs and offers splendid views on the sea and Konavle region with beautiful cypress forests. During the hike you will have opportunities for a refreshment in the blue Adriatic Sea. The length of the trail is 15 kilometres.



PASJAČA BEACH

One of the most impressive beaches of Croatia, located under the Konavle cliffs, near the village Popovići. The path leading to the beach is carved in the cliffs stone.



MOLUNAT BEACH

Molunat is one of the southernmost villages in Croatia, a typical small settlement, enclosed in a pretty bay with a sandy beach. There are bars and restaurants on the seafront.

QUAD IN KONAVLE REGION

Meeting in Kojan Koral centre in the village Radovčići.

09:00 a.m.: Presentation of the equipment and instructions.

Two persons per quad vehicle.

You will start in the village Radovčići, descend to the Konavle plain, cross several times the river Ljuta and climb to the town of Čilipi before returning along the cliffs to Radovčići.

Coffee break in the town of Čilipi (coffee not included) and visit the small museum of Konavle traditions. Juice or water will be served at the end of the tour.

Duration of the tour: 3h30 – 4h

Very nice and easy tour allowing you to discover the beauties of Konavle region known for its microclimate created by mount Sniježnica peaking at 1234m and the Adriatic Sea. You will also enjoy the cypress forests harbouring typical stone villages.



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DIVING IN MOLUNAT

The Konavle cliffs and the absence of islands make Molunat a privileged diving site. You will discover the depths, limestone concretions typical of the Croatian coast and an almost intact fauna and flora.

The diving session is organized by a professional diving club, approved according to international rules. With 36m of horizontal transparency, the sea of the Dubrovnik region is among the clearest in the Mediterranean.



KOTOR BAY IN MONTENEGRO

The Montenegrin border is on the southern part of the Konavle region.

After the border crossing, you will be immersed in the beautiful landscape of the Kotor bay and its organic appearance with steep mountain slopes reminding of a fjord.

We recommend driving along the coastal road to the town of Perast.

Discover Perast. The entire town is listed as historical heritage. Perast is a museum town with baroque architecture and beautiful palaces witnessing the great maritime past. After a pleasant seaside stroll you can board a shuttle boat and sail to the islet and the church of Our lady of the Rocks located just opposite of the town.

Sailing time: 10 minutes

Visit the votive church, built on an artificial island by the inhabitants of Perast as a homage to the

icon of the virgin which, according to a legend, was found on a rock on the high seas. Austere from the outside, you will be impressed by the largest collection of votive offerings in the world and by the beauty of the baroque paintings (entrance tickets and shuttle boat are not included).



Return to Perast and continue to Kotor by the seaside road.

Travel time: 20 min

Kotor is a fortified medieval city which built its reputation on trade and maritime transport. A meeting of cultures where you will find both Catholic and Orthodox churches. We recommend visiting the Saint Triphon cathedral and the Maritime museum.

Return to Konavle. Travel time: 1h30

ISLAND OF KORČULA

We recommend driving to the town of Orebić by crossing the Pelješac peninsula and its wild landscapes. Take a shuttle boat to the town of Korčula.

Korčula is one of the largest islands in southern Dalmatia. Its strategic position has aroused envy of great powers and blessed the town with a rich cultural heritage. Korčula embodies the spirit of the Dalmatian islands marked by the Venetian domination especially through the still active brotherhoods, part of today's tradition. Korčula is also the birthplace of the great merchant and traveller Marco Polo.



DELTA OF THE NERETVA RIVER

The Neretva Delta is a wetland covering an area of more than 300 km². It was drained in the 19th century by canals to form an impressive, very fertile hortillonnage in which citrus fruits, mostly mandarins, oranges and lemons, as well as many vegetables are cultivated. The main feature of the delta are reed beds and fields of water lilies sheltering more than 150 species of birds, amphibians and the eel. During the Middle Ages this area was inhabited by pirates sailing on heavy, flat-bottomed boats called "lađa". Board on a large flat-bottomed boat and sail through the network of canals and reed beds.



Traditional lunch will be served on the boat: eel and frog legs in bouillabaisse with polenta with a glass of local wine and water (possibility of a mixed meat dish).

EXTENSION 3: 4 DAYS TOUR IN DALMATIA WITH THE ISLANDS KORČULA, HVAR AND THE CITY OF SPLIT

Day 5: Korčula, Marco Polo's birthplace – overnight in Korčula

Taxi transfer from your accommodation to the port of Dubrovnik.

Board a fast boat (regular line) to Korčula.

Crossing time: 7 AM to 9 AM

The fast boat features a bar where you can enjoy a light breakfast.



Check in to hotel Korsal in Korčula.

Located in a pedestrian area by the beach, the hotel is just a 5-10 minutes' walk from the old town and the port of Korčula. Korsal is a charming boutique hotel set in an old stone shipowners' palace. An authentic and original setting blending tradition and modern design. The hotel's restaurant is a real gem.

Optional: Transfer with luggage portage from the port to the hotel



Discover Korčula.

We recommend visiting the Icons museum, the City museum, the cathedral and the Bishop's Palace. If possible, attend the sword dance show of Korčula called "Moreška", depicting the battles against the Ottomans.

Korčula embodies the spirit of the Dalmatian islands marked by the Venetian domination. Its history is marked by the still active brotherhoods. Korčula is the birthplace of the great merchant and traveller Marco Polo.



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Lunch and dinner on own.

Day 6: Island Hvar – overnight in Split

Breakfast.

5-minute walk with your luggage to the port.

Optional: Transfer and luggage portage from the hotel to the port = 15,00 € (total price for 1 to 2 travellers)

09:15 a.m. Board a fast boat (regular line) to Hvar. Estimated arrival at 10:30 a.m.

Take your luggage to the Hvar locker located in the port (fees to be paid on the spot).

Discovery and swimming.

Lunch on own.

We suggest a beautiful hike starting in the town Hvar, climbing to the fort of Napoleon offering a beautiful view of the bay and following the mountain's crests before descending by the vineyards to the sea and returning to Hvar following the coast. Level: easy-medium (3/5) - duration of the hike with breaks: 6h

Hvar is an island with a very mild climate and strong sunshine, suitable for the cultivation of lavender from which essential oils are extracted for medicines and perfumes. These conditions made tourism develop there as in Dubrovnik or Opatija from the end of the 19th century. The town of Hvar is marked by Venetian influence while preserving the character of the Dalmatian ports with their stone architecture. Hvar has always, and still today attracts the world elite for its magical setting.



07:10 p.m. Board a fast boat (regular line) to Split. Estimated arrival time: 08:25 p.m.

Short 5-10 minute walk to the Cornaro hotel.

Optional: Transfer and luggage portage from the port to the hotel.

Check in to hotel Cornaro. Dinner on own.

The hotel is located in the city centre of Split on the northern part of the Diocletian Palace. The building is an old Dalmatian palace, a blend of ancient art and modern eclecticism. The hotel features an indoor and outdoor jacuzzi, wellness and sauna.



Day 7: Split (UNESCO) – overnight in Split

Breakfast.

Split is a unique living monument. The original Roman palace was repeatedly transformed throughout history, each era leaving a mark resulting in an astonishing fusion of architectural styles in constant turmoil. Split today is the second largest city of the country and the biggest passenger port. The cathedral is a beautiful example of the Split's spirit as it changed from mausoleum of the biggest Christian persecutor Diocletian to today's Christian Catholic cathedral.



This apparently contradictory way of preserving the Emperor Diocletian's palace earned it its UNESCO World Heritage status.

Lunch and dinner on own.

Taxi transfer from your hotel to Split airport.
